
From the Desk of Pastor Rob

My brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of any kind, consider it nothing but joy, because you know that the testing of your faith produces endurance; and let endurance have its full effect, so that you may be mature and complete, lacking in nothing. – James 1:2-4

And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. – 1 Corinthians 5:3-5

There are many times in our lives where we find our faith tested. We go through rough patches in our lives and we begin to doubt our faith, wondering why these things are happening to us or to those around us and why would God let something

like this happen. Our faith wavers and we question it more and more, not sure where to turn next. We think that this suffering is because of something we did wrong, or that "it's all part of God's plan." As for the latter, that phrase is something we need to remove from this context because God never wants us to suffer and would never make that part of any plan for us.



We have all gone through these periods, myself included. Part of my seminary experience was

spending a summer as a chaplain intern in a hospital setting. I could have chosen any of the hospital networks in Columbus, but as a newly minted parent, I decided to spend my ten-week internship working at Nationwide Children's Hospital, a decision that seemed questionable at the time but one that I would never change. As a chaplain intern, I was assigned to two different floors in the hospital, one being the waiting room for in-patient surgeries and the other consisting of the recovery rooms for surgery and the pediatric burn unit. It was a summer I will never forget. It tested my faith and I spent many debriefing sessions with my supervisor wondering why God would let these things to happen to those children and why I was able to go home to a healthy child at the end of the day. My faith was tested to a point that I never experienced. My supervisor recommended a book to me, "When Bad Things Happen to Good People" by Rabbi Harold Kushner, which looks at the book of Job and the story of how he was tested to his limits but yet his faith was still there. That book helped me understand that what I was experiencing was normal and that all the pain, suffering, and hurt I was witnessing and ministering to was not because God wanted them to suffer or because those families lacked enough faith, rather it was because that was the natural course of life.

We may start to express our doubts but as I said in a recent sermon, these doubts are not meant to weaken our faith, but strengthen it, because we start to dig deeper into what our faith is, looking for the answers that we so desperately want and the proof that we think we need. The trials we face in life are not meant to break us. They may test our will, our strength, and our faith but as long as we remember our faith, we can overcome them. And when it is too much for us to bear, God is there to help carry us through the day. God will never forsake or leave us in our darkest moments. Just as applying heat to steel strengthens it, the pressures and tests on our faith also strengthen it. The end result of all of this is hope, and as St. Paul reminds us, hope does not disappoint and hope will abide alongside faith and love.

Emmanuel's Fund Balances

Here is a breakdown of the monetary funds and their approximate balances as of March 31, 2023. (Some remain unchanged due to lack of report from Raymond James)

General Fund ~ **\$17,000** (This fund is used for all general monthly expenses, including payroll, utilities, etc.)

Endowment Fund ~ **\$192,000** (This fund is used for mission, outreach, and capital improvements to our facility.)

Nancy Phillips Fund ~\$81,000 (This fund has no specific designated use and is used at the discretion of Council.)

M.R. Zuchegno Fund ~\$12,000

(This fund established in 2016 has been used as an 'emergency' fund, providing monies when deficits bring our General Fund balance below \$5,000.)

Property Fund

(This fund is used for immediate facility repairs.)

~\$500

Memorial Fund ~\$19,000

(This fund contains undesignated money given 'in memoriam' and can be used at the discretion of Council.)

Hick's Scholarship ~\$57,900

(This fund is used solely for scholarships to students attending higher education institutions.)

Organ Fund ~\$50,000 (This fund is for the future

overhaul of the sanctuary organ.)

Wednesdays at Emmanuel


Exciting new and returning events are coming starting this month.


